Ethan Tabakin introduced the proposal and provided overview of the CDBG program, described total CDBG funds available for CDBG-PF (\$15,355,000 in CDBG - Disaster Recovery funds), and activity types eligible for this funding (CDBG-PF).

Sarah Lerner from Engineering introduced to answer questions from committee on stormwater proposal.

Community Development needs identified by Tabakin and Lerner (Planning, Public Facilities, Economic Development, and/or Public Facilities for Economic Development).

Ethan Tabakin described activities proposed for the CDBG application, and the potential for residential and/or business displacement as a result of the proposed CDBG activities.
