Linette Rhodes, City of Madison Community Development Division Supervisor, provided presentation on the men's shelter site selection.

Linette Rhodes and Jim O'Keefe from the City of Madison Community Development Division answered committee member questions, including shelter access and transportation; zoning, covenants and other administrative barriers; proximity to available services; temporary to permanent men's shelter transition timing; possibility of a 24/7 shelter; community outreach and neighborhood engagement; potential accommodation for vehicle campers; and likelihood of finding an alternate site that meet the site selection criteria.

Staff also answered questions from Alder Baldeh regarding the site's proximity to planned rapid transit, timeline, capacity, and community engagement.

Lemmer asked Mick Conrad, public comment registrant, to share additional comment.
