- Any public outreach to Well 15 users about adverse effects of PFAS? (A: Community & Neighborhood Association meetings held. Individuals at the meetings received information on the health effects of PFAS exposure.)
- When was Well 15 shut down, & how did the City make sure enough water was available? (A: March 2019. Compensated with other wells in the same zone.)
- What's the testing frequency for fish? (A: Testing that the DNR does happens each season.)
