The 4-day fall celebration saw a 50% increase in

The annual fund appeal is going on now and exceeding benchmarks. Ex Libris grossed over \$100,000 this year. The MPLF Board voted to initiate the capital campaign for the Imagination Center at Reindahl Park which officially begins in January 2023.

Kathy Michaelis reported that the Friends groups as a whole are gathering to do a policy and procedure survey to look at things like fundraising and recruitment. There is a tentative meeting for January to discuss the next big book sale. Meadowridge Friends are having pie sales again, which seems to be going well. Goodman South Friends are working with Delta Beer Lab to set up a story slam. The annual meeting of the Pinney Friends will be on Monday via Zoom with author Kathleen Ernst as the speaker.
