2. <u>71137</u> Introduction and Overview

Donahue delivered introductory remarks, noting the City's desire to update its key plan documents, review service provider performance, and examine opportunities to reduce costs on the Lincoln plan over the course of three successive meetings, this being the first.

The Capital Group began outlining different service provider roles on the Lincoln plan as set forth in their presentation, attached to this file as Attachment B. Higgins inquired regarding bundled and unbundled plan structuring, the role of Epic Retirement Plan Services, and potential costs savings associated with indexed-based target date funds. Various members noted participant confusion with communications about (1) ABG's transition of services to EPIC and (2) the Lincoln plan's current unbundled structure. Participant displeasure with Epic's current quality of service also discussed. Donahue directed The Capital Group to analyze the current service provider relationships and present options at the forthcoming meetings.
