Fiscal Note

As stated in the Employment Agreement between the City of Madison and Michael P. May, the City Attorney’s initial year’s salary will be based on a total annualized rate of \$170,309 effective May 18, 2019. The City Attorney position is approved and funded in the 2019 Adopted Operating Budget. Annual salary adjustments may be made during the term of the agreement at the Mayor’s discretion, subject to Common Council approval.
