Fiscal Note

As stated in the Employment Agreement between the City of Madison and James D. O’Keefe, the Community Development Division (CDD) Director’s salary will be based on an annualized rate of \$141,308, effective October 17, 2022. The CDD Director position is approved and funded in the 2022 adopted operating budget. Annual salary adjustments may be made during the term of the agreement at the Mayor’s discretion, subject to Common Council approval.
