Board of Park Commissioners Celebrating July as National Park and Recreation Month

WHEREAS, the City of Madison has nearly 6,000 acres devoted to parks and open space for recreational activities that enhance the physical health and mental well-being of the community; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Madison Parks Division collaborates with organizations such as the Madison Metropolitan School District and Madison School Community Recreation (MSCR), among others to promote participation in recreation programs to build self-esteem and provide positive and constructive alternatives to anti-social behavior; and,
