## **Fiscal Note**

No City Funds required. Private contract.

## Title

Approving plans and specifications for public right-of-way improvements necessary for the project known as 118 W Wilson Street - Dane County Jail Consolidation and authorizing construction to be undertaken by the Developer, Private Contract No. 9345 (District 4)

## **Body**

WHEREAS, the developer, Dane County Department of Administration, Public Works, has received the City of Madison's conditional approval to rezone 118 West Wilson Street and 115 West Doty Street from Planned Development-General Development Plan-Specific Implementation Plan (PD-GDP-SIP) to Amended PD-GDP-SIP to complete the proposed Dane County Jail Consolidation, and,

WHEREAS, Section 16.23(9) of the Madison General Ordinances and the conditions of approval require the developer to install the public improvements necessary to serve the rezoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute a Contract For the Construction of Public Improvements that will be accepted by the City of Madison For 118 W Wilson Street - Dane County Jail Consolidation, with Dane County Department of Administration, Public Works.
- 2. That the plans and specifications for the public improvements necessary to serve the development are hereby approved.
- 3. That the developer is authorized to construct the public improvements in accordance with the terms of the Contract For the Construction of Public Improvements That Will be Accepted by the City of Madison at the sole cost of the developer, except as follows: NONE
- 4. That the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to sign and grant easements or right-of-way release or procurement documents, maintenance agreements or encroachment agreements, as necessary and grant or accept dedication of lands and/or easements from/to the Developer/Owner for public improvements located outside of existing public fee title or easement right-of-ways.
- 5. The Common Council is approved to accept ownership of the improvements in the Maintenance Area if a maintenance agreement is executed and recorded as a condition of this contract.
- 6. The developer shall be permitted to assign this contract for the purposes of obtaining financing in a form to be approved by the City Attorney.
