WHEREAS, *The Capital City Hues* is celebrating its five year anniversary with The Hues Alive at Five: Celebrating Our Communities of Culture on the 200 Block of Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard on Sunday, June 26, 2011, to reflect Dr. King's Beloved Community;
