Fiscal Note

Costs for the remainder of 2012 are estimated at \$201 for wage expense, plus \$73 for fringe benefits, or a total expense of \$274. These amounts will be accommodated in 2012 by the management of Traffic Engineering salary savings. Annualized costs are estimated at \$5,753, or \$7,841 including benefits, based upon a comparison of maximums. These costs will be included in future year Traffic Engineering operating budget requests.
