ARBOR WEEK PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, trees in our city will reduce the erosion of topsoil by wind and water; and

**WHEREAS**, trees clean the air, sequester excess carbon, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

**WHEREAS**, Madison has been recognized as a Tree City USA by the Arbor Day Foundation for 24 consecutive years and desires to continue its tree planting ways; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER PROCLAIMED, by the City of Madison that April 21 thru 27<sup>th</sup> is Arbor Week 2013 in the City of Madison and all residents are urged to protect our trees and woodlands, to support our urban forestry program, and to plant trees to promote the well-being of present and future generations.**
