#### **Title**

Creating Section 9.01(2)(a) of the Madison General Ordinances to allow the clerk to issue a license or permit to an applicant who owes unpaid forfeitures provided applicant is under a payment plan.

## **Body**

DRAFTER'S ANALYSIS: This proposal would permit the City Clerk to issue a license or permit to an applicant that owes unpaid forfeitures, provided that the applicant has entered into a payment plan for the amount owed, payments have been made under the payment plan and the applicant is current under the payment plan.

The Common Council of the City of Madison do hereby ordain as follows:

Subdivision (a) entitled "Payment Plans" of Subsection (2) of Section 9.01 entitled "Duty of Clerk with Regard to Licenses; Payment of Taxes, Claims, Forfeitures, Judgments, etc., Appeal" of the Madison General Ordinances is created to read as follows:

- "(a) Payment Plans. Notwithstanding Subsection (2), the City Clerk may issue a license or permit to an applicant who owes money to the City for unpaid forfeitures or judgments resulting from conviction for violation of any Madison General Ordinance if the applicant:
  - 1. Has entered into a payment plan for payment of the money owed to the City;
  - 2. Has made payments to the City under said payment plan; and
  - 3. Is current with such payments."
