Fiscal Note

In the adopted 2016 capital budget the Sewer Utility has budgeted \$2.3 million within the Trenchless Sewer Rehabilitation program to repair failing sewers through a non-invasive pipe lining method (MUNIS 10450). The minor project for the 2016 Cured In Place Piping (CIPP) is established with sufficient budget authority for the proposed contract. (MUNIS 11473). Funding is provided by utility reserves and revenue bonds.

The proposed resolution awards the contract at a total estimated cost of \$760,680 split amongst agencies as follows:

- Sewer Utility - \$695,590
- Stormwater Utility - \$57,020
- Parks - \$8,070
