**Fiscal Note**

**Title**

Amending Section 38.10(1)(a)7. of the Madison General Ordinances to amend a statutory reference; and creating Sections 38.10(1)(a)9. through 38.10(1)(a)13. of the Madison General Ordinances to establish additional criteria for alcohol license suspension or revocation.

**Body**

DRAFTER'S ANALYSIS: This ordinance amends a statutory reference and creates additional criteria for alcohol license suspension or revocation.

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The Common Council of the City of Madison do hereby ordain as follows:

1. Paragraph 7. of Subdivision (a) entitled "Complaint" of Subsection (1) of Section 38.10 entitled "Revocation, Suspension or Nonrenewal of License" of the Madison General Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

"7. The person has been convicted of manufacturing or delivering a controlled substance under Wis. Stat. § ~~461.41~~941.41(1); of possessing, with intent to manufacture or deliver, a controlled substance under Wis. Stat. § ~~461.41~~941.41(1m); or of possessing, with intent to manufacture or deliver, or of manufacturing or delivering a controlled substance under a substantially similar federal law or a substantially similar law of another state."

2. Paragraphs 9. through 13. of Subdivision (a) entitled "Complaint" of Subsection (1) of Section 38.10 entitled "Revocation, Suspension or Nonrenewal of License" of the Madison General Ordinances are created to read as follows:

- "9. The licensee has violated a condition included on its license.
- 10. The person has made any material false statement in any application for a license.
- 11. The person has failed to operate the licensed establishment in accordance with the floor plan and plan of operation submitted to the City as part of the licensing process.
- 12. The licensed premises has been operated in such a manner that it constitutes a public or private nuisance or that conduct on the licensed premises, including but not limited to raucous noise, has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health and safety of the immediate neighborhood.
- 13. The violation of any of the excise laws of this state."
